The 14th SEAMC graduation service was held on Feb 22, 2020. There were 22 students that graduated from our Mission College in Yangon.



Early this year, we received a call from a Harvest Partner church wishing to assist in some short-term way to bless pastors of local churches in the nations that were not receiving regular support. They wanted to affect some kind of investment that would assist a pastor or two in building some support that would bring about regular income for that pastor. Previously, this Harvest Partner church had helped to start self-sustaining goat and chicken farms in Nepal for pastors there.

We reached out to Brother Chin Kang Mon, our National Overseer of Myanmar, to see if he possibly had any pastors who would be interested in a similar project. Brother Chin responded quickly with a list of five pastors, the type of farms they each felt they could create, maintain, and the costs of each project. The funds would be used to purchase pigs or goats, buy 3 months' worth of food, and build the farms. After receiving and sharing these projects, we had 2 Harvest Partner churches and an individual donor fulfill all the suggested projects.

Brother Chin recently sent us an update on a few of the pastors who have already begun their projects. Pastor Saw James from the Agape Mission Church has happily started his project with 10 goats. Pastor Aung Mee from the Bethlehem Mission Church in Taung Maan, Pastor Maung Maung Oo from the Ayetharyar Mission Church in Taungyi, and Pastor Mang Kee from New Hope Mission Church were able to start pig farms with 5 pigs each. Brother Chin is grateful that the support offered by these donors have helped these pastors to begin a self-sustaining project that will bless them for years to come.
